Check-in, catch- up and prepare

Following eleven weeks of lockdown, we are now making plans for children to be given the opportunity to return to school before the summer holidays for a 'check-in, catch-up and prepare.' The start date for this will be Monday June 29th, for four weeks. As a result, the autumn term half term has been extended by an extra week, the date of which has yet to be confirmed. This decision has been taken based on scientific advice presented to Welsh Government.

Thank you very much to those of you have filled out the recent questionnaire regarding this. It is good to see so many families engaged in supporting their children in their home learning in such a positive way. I will appreciate that there will be many of you who are anxious regarding this re-opening, but we will keep you informed as we formulate a plan to enable these opportunities to take place safely.

We have received the operational guidance from Welsh Government and we are translating that guidance to how this will look at St Francis. We are planning for the children to have at least three days for each child in a small groups of their classmates. The careful and safe re-opening of St Francis Catholic School will present a unique set of challenges which will now become the staff, governor and local authority's main priority over the next two weeks. We aim to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our learners, our staff and the wider school community in all that we plan and prepare.

In the meantime, we will continue to provide the online learning as well as the phased return to school. We will implement the return to school in line with local and national guidance and we will keep you informed of how this will look for our school. There is not going to be a quick return to how things were before lockdown. Our 'new normal' will be quite different, but all families and learners can be as confident as possible that everything is being done to facilitate a safe return for all.


