Humanities

Our first topic of this term is 'What's your superpower?'. We will be exploring this topic across the curriculum and the teaching will support the development of Literacy, Numeracy, Welsh and ICT skills. We will also begin embedding the new curriculum's Four Purposes. Throughout this topic, the children will be at the centre of their learning in planning what they would like to find out. We will begin by exploring how we are superheroes and who we see as superheroes in our families and community. Following on from this, we will learn about real life superheroes and how they make a difference to our world. We will finish off the topic with a focus on the children's favourite well-known superheroes and how they use their powers/skills to help others.

Languages, Literacy and Communication

This term we will follow the Talk for Writing approach in Literacy and will be studying the stories of 'Superworm' and 'Supertato'. Pupils will be given the apportunities to explore recounting the story orally, pictorially and in written form, letter writing, and exploring a number of nursery rhymes. As part of our 'What's your superpower?' topic, pupils will also explore writing lists and labels. There will be a number of apportunities to develop aracy skills throughout the classroom, during daily routines and in the form of a role play

Pupils will continue to follow the Read, Write, Inc phonics programme through daily phonics sessions in small groups to develop their reading and writing skills.
